Wildlife Conservation & Hunting (Bob Austman)

CHANGES FOR 2023 HUNTING SEASON:

- 1. In order to increase the surveillance or Chronic Wasting Disease, the province is increasing the number of Mule Deer tags to 3 tags per hunter at \$5 each. Only does may be harvested. All Game Hunting Areas in the south-western Manitoba are open for Mule Deer at the same time White-tail Deer season is open.
- 2. New rules for foreign non-resident waterfowl hunters. Due to increased tension between resident Manitoba water fowlers and American hunters, the province has enacted legislation to make non-resident waterfowl hunting licenses available on a draw basis. A certain number of licenses will be made available to registered outfitters. Some U.S. hunters who purchased land will be able to continue to hunt there as they are grandfathered in. The idea is to reduce the conflict over prime hunting land, which in the last decade has been occupied by American hunters, which has shut out local water fowl hunters. CWD testing. Hunters now have 7 days rather than 2 days to submit tissues for testing, and can submit lymph nodes rather than the entire head. Refer to the province's website at www.gov.mb.ca/hunting for the link to a video to show the lymph nodes can be removed from the neck region of a whitetail deer. Simply place the lymph nodes in a zip lock bag, and bring it to the nearest collection depot. They can be frozen without interfering with the testing process.
